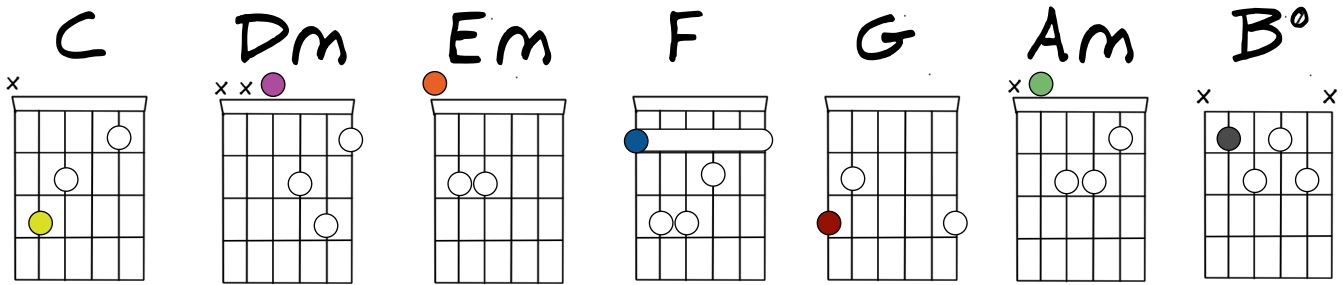


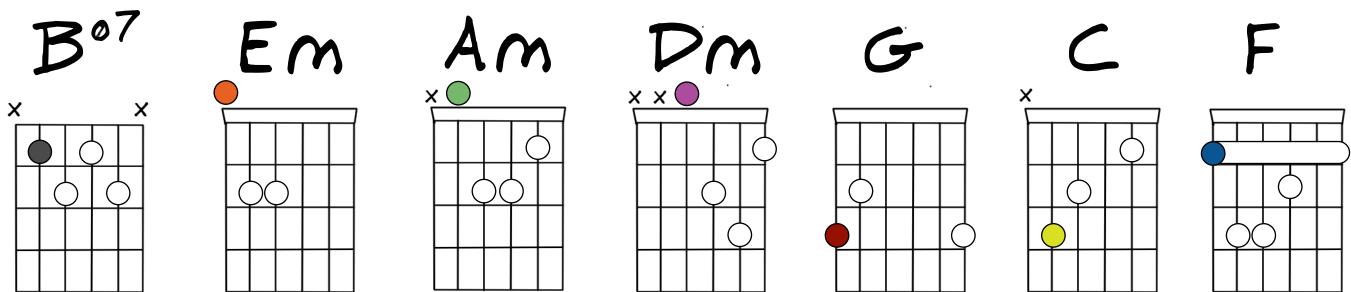
Chord Flow

How to use Chord Flow to organize chords in the key of C

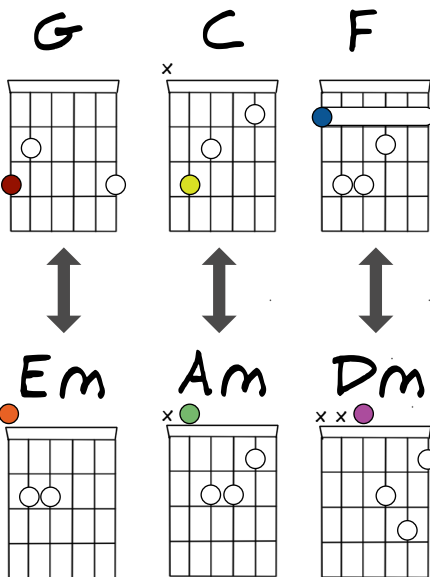
If you look up chords in the key of C in most music books, you'll see something like this, with all the chords arranged in order alphabetically. This is useful.



The memory tool BEAD Guides Chord Flow goes a step further organizing the key of C into chords that like to play with each other.



BEAD Guides Chord Flow groups together the major chords, G, C, and F, as neighbors.



It also groups together the minor chords, Em, Am, and Dm, as neighbors

Bonus!
When you stack the major chords over the minor chords as seen here, each chord is lined up vertically with a related chord substitute:

G with Em
C with Am
F with Dm
